GRADUATE CERTIFICATE begins August 2015

PROGRAM SUMMARY

The UBC Graduate Certificate in High Performance Coaching and Technical Leadership is a one-year, 12 credit specialized program for experienced sport coaches and technical managers who are looking to advance in their careers.

The program is composed of 4 graduate level courses, and begins with a 6-day residential institute held at UBC Vancouver in August 2015. The schedule and online teaching methods are designed to facilitate the participation of candidates from across Canada and around the world.

COURSES

GAP ANALYSIS

(KIN 515)

Using analytics to: obtain and describe data to create sport and athlete profiles; determine optimal programming decisions for athletes based on progression pathway and gold medal profile; apply research methods and scientific inquiry to performance analysis.

PERFORMANCE PLANNING

(KIN 585)

Using information obtained from sport profile and gap analysis, to plan and design high performance programs that enable athlete progression related to athlete pathway. The focus will be on quadrennial, annual, mesocycle and microcycle planning to integrate key factors that will impact athlete performance and progression.

COACHING EFFECTIVENESS

(KIN 586)

Investigate the relationship between athlete performance and coaching intervention strategies to ensure enhanced athlete development and skill acquisition. Examine structure and function of practice and feedback strategies to enable a resilient and self regulated athlete or coach capable of creating podium performance.

DIRECTED FIELD STUDIES: PRACTICUM (KIN 598)

Application of concepts/topics; coaching mentorship; project to reflect changes in coaching practice. Support to be provided by the candidate's National Sport Organization, and/or regional Canadian Sport Institute. Technical leader practicum is to be in the candidate's workplace or as a volunteer doing a specific project for an organization.



PROGRAM DESIGN COURSE STRUCTURE

- **F2F (face-to-face)**: the residential institute | 10 hours per course (August)
- Web: online webinars, at scheduled dates & times | 24 hours per course (September April)
- Asynchronous: online asynchronous content, accessed at anytime | 6 hours per course (September August)

RESIDENTIAL INSTITUTE UBC VANCOUVER

Participants attend a 6-day residential institute at UBC Vancouver in August 2015. While the institute will be intensive from 9am-4pm most days, you will also experience coastal BC in the long days of summer!

COST 2015/16 TUITION

Tuition is charged per course at *\$1,540 for domestic students and *\$2,433.2 for international students. Proposed 2015/16 program totals are:

- \$6,160 for domestic students
- \$9,733 for international students.

Additional fees include accommodation and transportation for the 6-day residential institute.

*Tuition fees are subject to University tuition fee increases, historically at 2% per year each May.
